One intriguing developmental pattern observed in this study is that among younger adolescents, there was not a significant likelihood of transitioning from delinquent behavior-only to substance use only; yet in middle adolescence (8 th to10 th grades), this developmental pathway did emerge. Given that this is the first investigation of this type into the progression of delinquency, substance use, and co-occurring behavior, caution must be exercised in interpreting this finding.
