Blues Scale Tutorial & Blues Scale Improv. At this point in our study of the blues, now it's time to introduce the blues scale. For many students, when starting out with blues improvisation, it's very easy to get locked inside the notes of the blues scale and never deviate away from 6 tones. The blues scale can sound amazing when used effectively, but the problem is that beginner jazz students will tend to just play up and down the scale for the whole solo.
